

A Glance at FY 2023

In fiscal year 2023, the NALC has been continuing its mission as the nation's leading source for agricultural & food law research and information. In doing so, it has continued to develop in both scope and reach. A primary method of reaching stakeholders, the **NALC** website, is a hub for resources and information on agricultural and food law topics. Pageviews, sessions, and users continue to experience exponential growth. For example, pageviews have seen an increase of 85% in the past three years, reaching almost 618,000 views in

FY23. Over that same time, both sessions and users have increased almost 50%.



Further, speaking events requested by stakeholders have also continued to grow, with attorneys speaking to at least 89 different audiences across the country. The green states reflect states with speaking events attended by NALC staff in FY23. It does not include remote conferences, podcast recordings or other speaking events without a physical presence. Whether a presentation be to a group of 10 at a county extension event or over 1,000 at a national conference, NALC staff expertise is utilized far and wide by the greater agricultural community. Digital outreach such as **NALC**

webinars are also an important component of its mission. In FY 23, the NALC hosted 18 webinars, with over 1000 cumulative in-person attendees. Recordings of those webinars are made available after the live event, and have since been viewed by an additional 1000+ people. We look forward to continued growth in FY24 and beyond!

Western Agricultural & Environmental Law Conference

Our 2nd Annual Western Conference is June 13-

14 at the **University of Nevada, Reno**. The Western is designed for both attorneys and nonattorney agricultural professionals involved in varying public and private aspects of the western agricultural industry.

In addition to providing an excellent networking opportunity, the Western features an excellent lineup of speakers discussing issues especially related to the western region of the country, such as foreign ownership of agricultural land,
