## National Agricultural Law Center Research Fellowship

The National Agricultural Law Center (NALC), a unit of the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture, is seeking to fill a Research Fellowship position in the area of estate and transition planning and agricultural taxation. This position is currently available for the fall of 2019. The position will focus on conducting legal research and writing projects that meaningfully assist the NALC and its partner, the Center for Agricultural Law & Taxation at Iowa State University, in serving state, regional, and national stakeholders in furtherance of its mission as the nation's leading source of objective agricultural and food law research and information. Specific areas of research include but are not limited to:

- Estate planning for agricultural producers;
- Transition planning for farms and farming entities; and
- Taxation issues impacting agricultural producers and agribusinesses.

Successful applicants must have earned a J.D. from an accredited law school and be currently enrolled in an LL.M. program focused on taxation. The applicant must demonstrate skills and experience in legal research and writing. A demonstrated interest and aptitude for tax and estate planning matters is required. Applications must include at least one, but not more than two, letters of reference. Previous experience or background in agriculture is preferred, but not required. Applicants <u>must</u> be motivated and capable of reliably implementing work projects in a distance working arrangement. This position will require a commitment of at least ten hours a week, with flexibility given for exams and other academic or holiday events.
