National Agricultural Law Center Research Fellowships

The National Agricultural Law Center (NALC), a unit of the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture, is seeking to fill several Research Fellowship positions. Positions are currently available for the summer and fall of 2021. The positions will focus on conducting legal research and writing projects that meaningfully assist the NALC and its partners in serving state, regional, and national stakeholders in furtherance of its mission as the nation's leading source of objective agricultural and food law research and information. Specific areas of research include but are not limited to:

- Environmental regulation of agriculture, including emerging issues such as carbon markets;
- Food safety and food labeling;
- Agricultural finance and credit;
- Legal issues for beginning, socially disadvantaged, and veteran farmers and ranchers; and
- Other relevant issues such as agricultural data and technology, land use, farm programs, local and regional food systems and agricultural labor.

In addition to this announcement, the Center is also seeking applicants specifically for the Scott E. Fancher Agricultural Law Fellowship. For more details on that Fellowship, please visit <u>https://bit.ly/2WqXuWU</u>.

Successful applicants for either fellowship will have completed at least their first year of law school and have demonstrated skills and experience in legal research and writing. *Applications must include at least one letter of reference that speaks to the applicant's research and writing skills*. Previous experience or background in agriculture is preferred, but not required. A GPA of 3.0 or higher is preferred, but not required. Applicants <u>must</u> be motivated and capable of reliably implementing work projects in a distance working arrangement. This position will require a commitment of at least ten hours a week, with flexibility given for exams and other academic or holiday events.

Interested individuals should submit a current resume, contact information for three references (including one letter from a reference focused on research and writing), an unofficial law school transcript and a writing sample (10 pages or less) to Senior Staff Attorney Elizabeth Rumley at <u>erumley@uark.edu</u>. Applications are due no later than April 14, 2021.
