


### Farm Bill Overview

- U.S. Government's largest financial commitment to food and agriculture producers
- Omnibus, multi year law governing food and agricultural programs
- If Congress allows a farm bill to expire, some programs cease to operate, some revert to permanent law, and some could continue to operate under annual appropriation

# 2023 Farm Bill - 117th Congress

- Split Congress Farm Bill work will be done during the 117th and the 118th Congress
- Slow start, but Committees have begun Farm Bill hearings
  - Policy highlights: crop insurance, rising input costs, rural broadband, renewable energy, climate-smart practices, conservation, research disaster prevention

- The 4 Corners of Ag Policy
  - Chairwoman Debbie Stabenow (D-MI) the "seasoned" leader within the 4 corners
    - Priorities include nutrition, specialty crops, climate change, and urban agriculture
  - Ranking Member John Boozman (R-AR) New to the
     Ranking Member slot
    - Priorities include southern agriculture, research and nutrition
  - o Chairman David Scott (D-GA) New to the Chair
    - Priorities include racial equity, climate and southern commodities
  - Ranking Member GT Thompson (R-PA) New to the Ranking Member role
    - Priorities include dairy, forestry and nutrition






# 2023 Farm Bill - State of the Farm Economy

- High crop prices and record -level exports point to a strong farm economy; however, substantial volatility and uncertainty remain.
  - o Supply chain shortages
  - Inflation/rising input costs net farm income is forecast to fall
  - o Interest rates
  - Recession worries continue
- Are farmers content with policy or looking for significant policy changes?







#### Farm Production Expenses Increasing 6% in 2022 Compared to 2021, After a 12% Increase in 2021 from 2020







#### **Government Programs Contributing to Net Farm Income**




## 2023 Farm Bill - Budget

\$30 trillion debt and deficits of approx. \$1.5 trillion/year

Expect this to be a \$0 baseline Farm Bill

#### 2022 Election

- President's party typically loses seats in midterm elections
  - Sub-50% approval rating = approx. -36 seats
- The last four presidents have lost Senate and House majorities; seven of those eight chambers were lost in midterm elections
- Over half of this year's toss up races are in districts with a sizable rural constituency




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
#### Referenda on President Biden's Handling of Key Issues / Approval Rating

- The direction of key agriculture policies will be determined by the 2022 election
  - Several AG Committee Members dace tough races
    - Spanberger (D-VA), Craig (D-MN), Harder (D-CA), Axne (D-IA), Schrier (D-WA),
       Warnock (D-GA)
  - o Several Ag Committee Members not returning
    - Bustos (D-IL), Delgado (D-NY), Hartzler (R-MO), Rush (D-IL), Leahy (D-VT)



- Republicans will likely look to reign in government spending on climate
- Democrats' priorities will likely include racial and economic justice, environmental justice, and expanding programs and funding to mitigate climate change




- Biden Administration's aggressive regulatory agenda
  - o Environmental & Energy
    - Canceling oil and gas leases on federal lands no new leases since
       2020
    - Renewable energy fallacy renewable is 11% of current energy (only 1/3 of which is solar and wind)
  - Labor
    - Contractors vs. full time
    - Apprenticeships
    - Federal bureaucracy has the upper hand













- Cash farm receipts forecast to be the highest on record at \$462 billion
- Production expenses also at highest on record at \$412 billion up 5% from 2021
- Government payments down
   \$15.5 billion 57%
- Net farm income \$114 billion down from all time high in 2013





- Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental (March 2020), CAREs Act (March 2020), Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act (April 2020), and the American Rescue Plan (March 2021) have totaled \$4.8 trillion
- Nutrition programs currently make up 3/4 of Farm Bill spending
- Commodity groups are developing
   Farm Bill proposals that include
   increases in reference prices and
   higher loan rates

   for Conservation Programs






Will pressures continue to lower payment limits and Adjusted Gross Income?
