The National Agricultural Law Center is establishing the Scott E. Fancher Agricultural Law Scholarship to honor the life and legacy of Scott Fancher (1954 – 2019). Scott was a farmer, USDA Farm Service Agency County Executive Director, and a talented agricultural lawyer with extensive knowledge on USDA programs and appeals, FSA Handbooks, and federal crop insurance arbitration. He was a homemade wine and whiskey maker,

musician, U.S. marine, a great supporter of the NALC, and much more. Most of all, he was a friend who genuinely believed in building up other people. The Scott E. Fancher Agricultural Law Scholarship will provide financial support for up to at least two undergraduate and/or law students interested in pursuing careers in agricultural law.
