




Greetings,

NALC presents at NASDA annual meeting in Indianapolis





NALC staff attended the **National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA)**'s annual meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana in September. The theme of this year's meeting was "Cultivating Common Ground." At the meeting, Director Harrison Pittman, Senior Staff Attorney Rusty Rumley, and Staff Attorney Brigit Rollins presented on "Agriculture in the Supreme Court" to the entire NASDA membership. They also spoke to the Natural Resources and Environment Committee, discussing the potential impacts of the Chevron doctrine being overturned by the U.S. Supreme Court. Pittman, Rumley, and Rollins also spent time connecting with **NASDA Next Generation** students about careers in ag law and legal issues facing agriculture.

In August, Director Pittman testified at a hearing before the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations subcommittee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies. The open session, titled "Perspectives on the Future of Agriculture Research and Technology," was held at the Grand Farm Innovation Campus in Wheatland, North Dakota. Pittman testified on a panel before Ranking Member Sen. John Hoeven (R- North Dakota), Sen. Amy Klobuchar (D- Minnesota), Sen. Tina Smith (D- Minnesota) and Sen. John Boozman (R- Arkansas).

Xochitl Torres Small (pictured left with Pittman), USDA Deputy Secretary, and **Dr. Chavonda Jacobs-Young**, USDA Under Secretary for Research, Education, and Economics, as well as Chief Scientist, also testified at the event, noting the importance of

partnerships such as the one between USDA and NALC. Read more about the event here.

Dedicated professionals from across the country traveled to Ohio in August, ready to learn more about creating successful farm transition plans. Available both in person and online, the conference was hosted by The Ohio State University Agricultural and Resource Law Program and co-sponsored by the NALC and the Center for Agricultural Law and Taxation at Iowa State University (CALT). Recognizing the need for further focus on this area, OSU and CALT partnered to create the Association of Farm Transition Planners in 2023.



At the conference, NALC Senior Staff Attorney Elizabeth Rumley moderated a panel about replenishing rural practice, discussing challenges for rural practitioners, what brings young professionals to rural practice, and what can be done to encourage and attract the next generation of agricultural professionals.

From Florida to Minnesota: More Outreach from NALC Staff

New resource compiles state approaches to heirs property

Heirs property is property held as tenants in common where, generally, the owners received their interests through inheritance. The owners may number in the hundreds or more, and methods to clear title are often difficult to implement. An increasing awareness of the difficulties faced by owners of heirs property prompted action by the Federal Emergency Management Administration and Congress through the 2018 Farm Bill to provide alternative means of proving ownership. However, these alternative means of showing title only apply in limited situations.



Jill Apter, NALC research fellow and student at Michigan State University College of Law, and **Jesse Richardson**, professor of law and lead land use attorney at West Virginia University College of Law, partnered with the NALC to conduct a 50-state survey of the methods, short of formal suits to clear title, that states offered to clear title to heirs property. That recently published survey is available **here**. A companion report, further expanding on the survey highlights, is available **here**. Further, they will be discussing their findings in more detail in an upcoming NALC webinar, **State Approaches to Clearing Title to Heirs Property**.





Property

"Heirs property" has disproportionately affected BIPOC communities, especially in the southern United States. A heirs property situation often occurs when a landowner passes away "intestate," without a will or other estate plan. As generations pass, the number of owners for a single property can increase significantly, and methods to clear title are often difficult to implement. **Jesse Richardson**, professor of law and lead land use attorney at West Virginia University College of Law, and **Jill Apter**, NALC research fellow and student at Michigan State University College of Law, will be discussing the results of their 50-state survey of different approaches to the issue, as well as highlighting some best practices.
