September, National Association of State the Departments Agriculture (NASDA), the NASDA Foundation, and the NALC signed a Memorandum of Understanding at the NASDA Annual Meeting to expand collaboration on agricultural law, policy, research, and student development. The MOU includes enhancing collaboration on the NASDA Next Generation student program initiative as well as a law-focused student fellowships/scholarships, the first of which will be the "Scott NALC-NASDA Fancher Agricultural Law Summer Fellowship". In the coming weeks, we'll announce other initiatives under the MOU designed to better serve state agriculture departments and the broader agricultural industry. Read more here.

Harrison Pittman discusses foreign investments on C-SPAN

In July, National Agricultural Law Center Director Harrison Pittman appeared on C-SPAN's **Washington Journal** to discuss foreign ownership of U.S. farmland, an issue that continues to play out at both state and federal levels. Citing data from the Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act (AFIDA), Pittman noted that roughly 3.5% of U.S. land is foreignowned, with Canada, the Netherlands, Italy, the U.K., and Germany accounting for most investments, primarily in forestry. discussion followed the Trump administration's announcement of the National Farm Security



Action Plan, which aims to curb foreign investment from adversarial countries, enhance AFIDA enforcement, and address concerns about agricultural data access. Watch the recording here.

Update in Ag Law at NASDA Annual Meeting



NALC staff attended the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA)'s annual meeting in Rogers, Arkansas in September. The theme of this year's meeting was 'Securing our Future through Agriculture.' At the meeting, Director Harrison Pittman, Senior Staff Attorneys Elizabeth and Rusty Rumley, and Staff Attorney Brigit Rollins led a Q&A on critical laws and regulations affecting the ag industry. Several NALC attorneys also participated in NASDA's agricultural attaché tour at the Arkansas Agricultural Experiment Station (where NALC is headquartered).

Legal Issues Facing the Poultry Industry

Senior Staff Attorney Elizabeth Rumley presented the WPSA Lecture, "Legal Challenges in Animal Agriculture: Implications for the Poultry Industry," at the 2025 Poultry Science Association Annual Meeting in Raleigh, N.C. this July. The event drew more than 1,200 attendees, comprising researchers, educators, students, and industry professionals, with a focus on science, professional development, and networking within the poultry industry.

Drawing on her extensive experience in agricultural and food law, Elizabeth explored legal issues facing the poultry industry, with a focus on laws and regulations affecting animal welfare and food safety. Attendees gained insights into how legal frameworks influence scientific research and the broader agricultural landscape.



NALC-NASDA Foundation partner for new fellowship opportunity

The NALC, NASDA, and the NASDA Foundation are launching the inaugural "Scott E. Fancher Agricultural Law NALC-NASDA Summer Fellowship".
