IN ST § 35-44.1-4-10

IN ST § 35-44.1-4-10 Obstructing a Firefighter, Law Enforcement Officer, Emergency Medical Person, or Rescue Team; Unmanned Aerial Vehicle

A person who operates an unmanned aerial vehicle in a manner that is intended to obstruct or interfere with:

- (1) a law enforcement officer;
- (2) a firefighter;
- (3) an emergency medical person; or
- (4) a member of a search and rescue team or mission;

while the individual described in subdivisions (1) through (4) is performing or attempting to perform the individual's official duties, commits public safety remote aerial interference, a Class A misdemeanor. However, the offense is a Level 6 felony if the person has a prior unrelated conviction under this section.
