Arizona Teen Crisis Solutions: Arizona Teen Crisis Solutions is a hotline available for parents of struggling and troubled teens. Their service is available 24-hours a day via cellphone and is most associated with the Phoenix area. Contact this service at (623) 879-9600 or visit their website here.

Teen Lifeline: This hotline is a peer counseling suicide hotline available from 3:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. daily within the perimeters of Maricopa County. The call numbers can be utilized by those outside of Maricopa County. Contact this hotline at (800) 248-TEEN or (800) 248-8336.
