

## Students Eligible:

Students must be enrolled in accredited law schools and have completed their first year of law school. **Enrollment is limited to 22 students** as follows:

- University of Oklahoma, College of Law – *maximum 10 students*
- University of Arkansas, Fayetteville
- Penn State, Dickinson
- Drake University
- University of Nebraska, Lincoln
- Oklahoma City University, College of Law
- Maximum of 12 students (total non-Oklahoma University) on a first-come, first-served basis

*If available seats, students from other law schools in the U.S. with a maximum of one student per school may enroll.*
